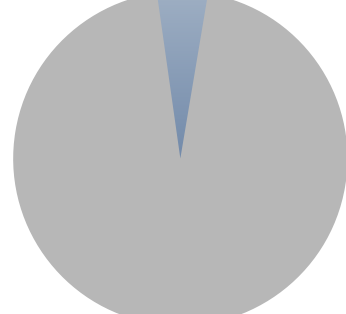

How Many People File For Bankruptcy In South Carolina?

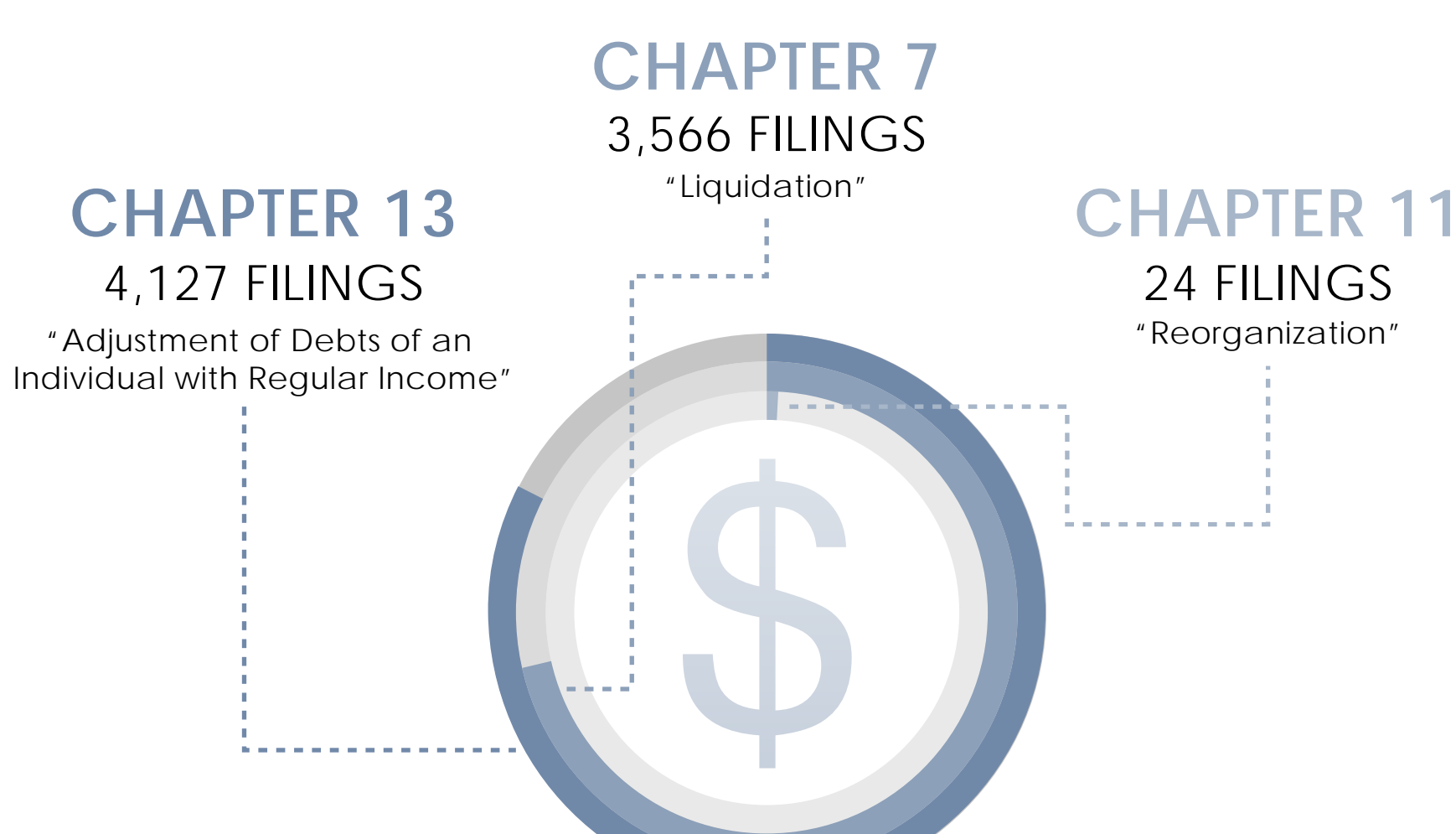
6,554 South Carolina RESIDENTS & BUSINESSES filed for BANKRUPTCY in 2017

97.8% of all bankruptcy filings were CONSUMERS (6,410 filings)



2.2% of all bankruptcy filings were BUSINESSES (144 filings)

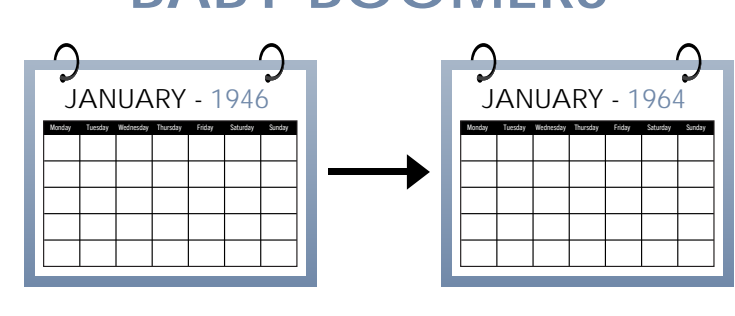
What Are The Most Common Types of Bankruptcy In South Carolina?

More than HALF OF FILERS are "BABY BOOMERS"



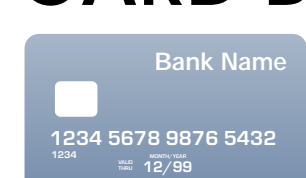
ONE IN FIVE FILERS are COLLEGE STUDENTS

People in URBAN AREAS had HIGHER BANKRUPTCY RATES

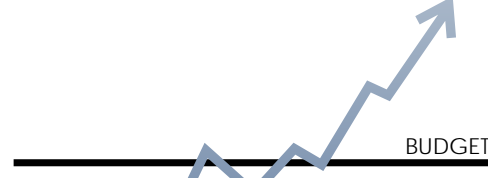


Why Do People File For Bankruptcy?
